United Way (UW) Presentation with Family & Children First (FCF) information, too:

- UW Need to raise funds to operate
- UW offers service to Greene/Preble/Montgomery Counties
- Review of UW 2-1-1 program to bring services to families—flyer provided
- <u>UW Vets Link</u> Program—flyers provided
- · Convening Services –United Way brings services together to assist families—this is done though the "<u>Strong Families</u>" program—Flyers provided.
- FCF provides services through the court system when needed –example was supervised visitation for parents.
- FCF Provides a <u>Parent Education Program</u>—Often for homeless, sheltered families but the program is open to all.
- FCFYouth Prevention Program—For those kids who are multi-system involved.
- · <u>UW/FCFBudgeting Courses for families</u>—through partnership with Chase Bank.
- <u>UW Beds Program</u>—provides beds to families for children who do not have beds—churches assist.

Greene ESC Superintendent, Terry Graves-Strieter briefly presented:

- <u>GCESC Careers—Summer Fair Day</u>—June 4th—for specific jobs at the GCESC Fair will be geared toward High School Students and College Students interested in pursuing work in the educational arena
- <u>Disconnect to Connect information</u>—Discussed dangers to children due to excessive cell phone usage
- · "Screenagers" Movie Screening April 22nd from 6 to 8 PM at GCESC -see flyer for detail. Pizza will be served.

- 4. Workforce: Mr. Chad Mason GCESC SCRUBS Day Career Event
 - Reviewed Scrubs Day event—shared the various jobs in the healthcare field that were represented —data from the event—53 students present every HS in Greene County represented.
- 5. Community Resources, Agencies, & Support: Mrs. Mary Francis SW Ohio School Based Health Center Alliance
 - Goal is to provide healthcare and services to families at the school level and location.
 - · Illustrated what a school-based health center operation can provide
 - Gave data illustrating the direct line as to what school-based services impact on educational outcomes.
 - · Money through state funding now available. Greene County is at the beginning stages—might be worth investigating and starting in more districts. Districts in Greene already providing GCESC Mental Health School-Based Services, which does give them a stronger case for having built infrastructure.
 - Begin by looking at local data to determine needs.
 - One school in Greene Co presently has an on-site Health Ctr—Xenia Community Schools.
 - Discussed ways this BAC group could assist in helping to build this type of program/service.
