- 5. **PreK-12, Post-Secondary, Workforce**: Dr. Cassie Barlow, President of Strategic Ohio Council for Higher Education (SOCHE); *Update on Intermediary Award, Hosting Student Interns, Details re: Miami Valley Intern Academy for Prospective Student Interns*
 - Non-profit in region engaging colleges, universities, K-12, and industries to transform economy through education and employment
 - Employs hundreds of interns in all types of jobs/businesses
 - Interns working in schools: help desks, chromebooks, update tech, inventory work, etc
 - Businesses who hire SOCHE Interns working in tech fields earn 100% reimbursement for up to \$5000.
 - Already have 25 students hired and working in first month
 - January start
 - Expanded to Electrical Wiring Internships

- o 100% reimbursement working in tech up to "off ramp" from high school and "on ramp" to employment
- o 50% reimbursement in non-tech fields for high school students
- o Recruiting all year high school and college students
- o Grant has NO limit from the state
 - Wanting to get as many students and businesses involved
 - Last year over 200 students employed
 - This year will surpass last year's numbers
- Next (final) meeting will be on April 3, 2024
