- More support to students who "fall through the cracks at the high school level" (students unsure about career options, no plans for college, and need more guidance)
- Global to start Build framework this year, working in partnership with district, support school counselors as additional resource
- First year covered by GCESC grant; Second/third years- a district will support the cost. ESC plans to expand to other districts who want the service.

 - Toward Independence-- in existence since mid-1970s
 - Provides services for individuals with intellectual disabilities in multiple counties
 - 24-hour supervision, group home placements, residential care and adult day programs, vehicles in every group home (over 60 homes), job placement, career planning
 - Non-Medical Transportation Services for adult day programs
 - Want to do more with connecting to local schools in their respective transition programs
 - Home and community-based waiver program
 - Summer programming available
 - Xenia One Bistro partnership, Focus on: socialization, skill learning, etc.
 - Mark Schlater--retiring December 2023. Joe Harmon will take his place.
 - Intend to keep growing partnerships w/ local businesses ie janitorial services, etc.

Rose will Share Highlights of the Fairborn HS "Unity through STEAM" First Annual Career & Workforce Dev Event.
 - Will highlight one "big scale" project completed w/ support from SOCHE intern at each BAC meeting this year
 - Intern Rose Davis-- hired by GCESC through SOCHE internship program (May 2023-October 2023) Rose is now a student at UD majoring in Communication & Media Production & Environmental Biology
 - Work included- Leadership Chats; Pre-Production work w/ Pathful Explore Production
 Team; Business/ Industry Partners on-site interviews: Francis Kennels, Xenia; Morris Bean
 & Co, Yellow Springs; NAMRU Dayton, WPAFB, Beavercreek), Fairborn HS STEAM Day
 filming/learning

- Pathful Explore Production team was very helpful and offered valuable direct feedback on editing and formatting for local clips; offered guidance on video angles, maximizing sound/video quality, and transitions.
- Video clips will be uploaded to Pathful Explore website on Local Landing Page for all districts to view through Pathful Explore platform access.

 - GCESC Partnership Gratitude expressed regarding Pathful Explore seats, along with Reading Interventions & Instructional coaching help from GCESC support team.
 - Origin of the Unity Day Event; desire to expand on focus of elevating stronger knowledge around current workforce needs
 - Student Experience/Engagement was greatly increased this year.
 - o STEAM "Strategies That Engage All Minds" Focus on including ALL teaching staff
 - In addition to the time spend with career/college fair, students could participate in a service project (with Crayons to Classrooms) and Traditional Unity Day Activities
 - Helpful feedback Survey data revealed many positive responses
 - Partnerships with local businesses, colleges, military, and many sponsors scholarship,
 job, and internship opportunities
 - Strong engagement from students; Fairborn HS used Pathful Explore career assessment inventories as a guide to direct students as to where to go/who to talk to for Unity Day, based on their individual results.

 - Additional structuring with Pathful Explore student seats
 - Teacher support for upcoming events, equipment sharing, speakers, etc.
