Community Resources & Support: Clothes That Work: Ms. Laura Hart, Director of Education & Outreach, Clothes That Work; *Overview of Mission; How to Connect for Services; New Mobile Unit Expands Reach*

- **Purpose:** Clothes That Work (CTW) supports men and women: returning to the work, or entering the workforce (first time); by outfitting people for interview and workplace attire including scrubs, work boots, depending on availability
- 2017 Workforce Education Initiative Supports people with resume-writing, interview practice and prep, soft skills development, etc.
 - Possible School Resources Can present in a class period; depending on schools' needs
 - *Ideal group size 25 or less but can do small groups; customizable to tailor needs);
 - Time frame for presentations for nonprofits About an hour or two, depending on organizational needs
- New Mobile Unit since June 2023 Services now available to people outside of Montgomery Co.
 - CTW has tied to our local Greene Co United Way through Strong Families Program which is helping to connect the program to Greene Co needs

- Moonshot Ohio: Goal--increase access to high-quality out-of-school time STEAM learning (beyond the formal classroom instruction students receive)
 - Students spend 80% of waking hours <u>outside of school</u> MUCH learning occurs before & after school, during summer, weekends, holidays, etc. How can we leverage that effectively to support growth?
- Projects & Affiliations: Intel Future Skills (essential skills) partnership, Teen Science Cafe Network; iSpace Girls in STEM, etc.
- Greene County BAC Summer Career Camp Pilot Amy Baldridge wrote a grant proposal on behalf of Greene County BAC --goals of expanding direct career exposure/experiences for students. Grant approved.
 - Key focus on sustainability after initial pilot
 - Designed to expand opportunities for students living in rural/small town settings w/ fewer resources;
 - Grades 6/7; STEAM activities, daily field trip visitations to selected industry partners
 - 4-day camp--Late June. <u>General Overview:</u>
 - Equal distribution of females males
 - Students, grades 6 and 7
 - Students w/ good conduct/good attendance
 - Students w/ solid (average) academic performers who might be overlooked for specialized enrichment opportunities or recognition
 - Tailored in grant language for students from smallest co districts (Cedar Cliff, Greeneview & Yellow Springs)
 - Break-down:
 - AM -focused lessons/hands-on projects aligned w/ selected career field focus;
 - PM-visitations to business/industries aligned w/ same selected career field focus
 - Participation Range: Minimum 8 students Maximum 20 students
 - Coordinating with four local business and industry partners to connect students with four specific career fields and professionals in their authentic work settings

 - Manufacturing Program Course Offerings through The Trades Institute
 - Certified Manufacturing Associate online coursework with live teacher
 - Work Readiness 101 Course
 - Starts April 29th
 - Trades Institute located at Emerge Center Campus
 - o GCESC BAC membership and network facilitated this connection

- Designed to reach audiences that do not normally apply for manufacturing jobs - Immediate focus on 18year-old students in Fairborn (Spring, 24)
 - Also focus on developing a year-long plan w/ selected FB high school program for 2024 25 school year
- DRMA grant:
 - Trades Institute provides education component and coaching
 - DRMA provides the companies that are looking to hire
 - FB high school provides student candidates
- Work Steadiness Course offered

 - Featured video interview: NAMRU, Dayton Jason Whatmore Chief Mechanical Engineer highlighted
 - Zachary Wilson, Public Affairs Officer, Naval Medical Research Unit (NAMRU, Dayton) present
- **6. Community Resources & Support:** Mrs. Ashley Miller, Founder/Executive Director, R House: Overview of New Resource Designed to Serve and Support Vulnerable Women in North Dayton
 - Ashley --a long-time, now former, employee of GCESC who worked as a program aide, & Certified
 Occupational Therapist Asst (COTA). Ashley has passion for service/helping others and created this program
 - R House = Relief, Resource, and Rescue
 - Nonprofit --supports vulnerable women associated w/ sex trafficking, addiction, abuse, and/or poverty
 - Street Outreach and Day Center
 - 1,000 square foot storefront
 - Offers fresh clothing, shower resources, hot meals, and portable, sustainable, shelf-stable food items to support sustenance on those days and times when R-House is closed;
 - **Objective:** Goal of expanding into other cities/locations since need is significant. **R House** wants to support disenfranchised, vulnerable women struggling with addiction, homelessness, and/or poverty
 - Mondays = Rehabilitation Group
 - Thursdays = Bible Study
 - <u>Transportation:</u> How can women access <u>R House</u> without cars to get to the facility? Do not want transportation to pose a barrier/working through solutions, including:
 - Bus passes can be distributed and/or Volunteer drivers often help transport
 - Basic Human Needs: Biggest needs-- access to showers, hot meals, and clean clothes
