- 3. **PreK-12, Workforce:** Ms. Brenda Sandman-Stover, 4-H Youth Development, OSU Extension, Greene County; *Overview of Available Programs, Incl*uding *Real Money/Real World School-Based Program Cultivating Life Skills through Instructional Lessons and a Culminating*

Simulation Exercise.

Ms. Brenda Sandman-Slover gave a presentation where she shared all of the programs and activities that 4-H and the OSU Extension organizations can bring into schools. Chick Embryology, Real Money/Real World, STEM activities, and the Mike Rowe Works were all highlighted.

4. **Pre-K**, **Post-Secondary**, **Workforce**: Dr. Amy Baldridge, *Overview of New Statutory Requirement*, *ORC 3302.03*, *Inserting BACs into the Local High School's Approval Process for the Work-Based Learning Submissions*. *Quick Overview of Collaboration Efforts - More to Come...* 

Dr. Baldridge shared that there is a new requirement regarding work-based learning and the role of BACs. She and Josh Baker (BVK) are going to be involved in a state committee on this matter and they will share more information at our next BAC meeting.

Discussion on the ODEW STARS for BACs was discussed with the pros and cons of submitting to this. More discussion will likely take place at the next BAC meeting.

5. PreK-12, Workforce: Dr. Jeff McClellan; Founder of StartSOLE Technology Company, and Creator of the PortfoliOH Technology Platform that Supports Both Schools and Businesses by Streamlining the Documentation of HS Students' Work-Based Learning Experiences.

Dr. Jeff McClellan gave an overview of the platform and how it works. He showed how it can align to the career work being done in schools/workplace to organize massive data related to maintaining and organizing career-related content, including seals/industry credentials in a one-stop platform. The program is free – due to funding from several sources, including: the Jacobs Foundation, various business partners, and the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce (ODEW).
